Overview	Students distinguish between the past and present and start to build on their knowledge and understanding of how the past is different from the present and how things have changed over time. Students undertake a study into families past and present. They use historical evidence including photographs and artefacts to draw comparisons between their own lives and the lives of early settlers in Australia. Students explore different ways of finding out about the past and start to evaluate different sources of evidence. Students begin to understand the importance of preserving history through sources. Students visit Rouse Hill Estate and learn about what life would have been like for children living there in the late 1800s.
