Overview	Introduction to syncopated rhythms. Understanding of the term syncopation in rhythm. Being able to recognise, read and perform basic syncopated rhythms. Instrumental program: learn guitar or bucket drums. Repertoire: Funga Alafia, Hey Syncopation, Senwa de Dende, Dragons Love Tacos.	Introduction to The Musical as part of Year 5 CAPA. Performance of songs and dances in the musical. Listening to and concept analysis of pieces from the musical. Composition exercises based on concepts from songs. Instrumental program: learn guitar or bucket drums. Repertoire: songs from the musical.	Introduction to a variety of 'Music from the Sea'. Pirate/sailor-based repertoire. Analysing the melodic construction of the melodies: movement by step, skip, leap or repeating notes. Composing own simple melodies based on melodic movement: step, skip, leap, repeating notes. Instrumental program: learn guitar or bucket drums. Repertoire: Black Pearl, Lake Pirates, The Wellerman, Drunken Sailor.	Introduction to compound time. 6/8 time signature. Singing and playing repertoire in the new time signature. Aural recognition of rhythms in compound time. Composition of short melodies using the new rhythmic concepts. Repertoire: Toboggan, Whack the Tarantula, Moses Supposes.
