Rachael Ingram is an experienced classroom teacher and learning support teacher who is currently working as the K-6 Learning Enrichment Coordinator at The Hills Grammar School. She understands both professionally and on a personal level, having experienced learning disabilities herself as a child, the key role the classroom teacher and learning support team play in ensuring that every student is able to access and engage in rich learning experiences that cater to their varying needs. For this reason, Rachael created a NESA approved online training course in 2018 on Practical Ways to Differentiate in the Primary Classroom. Prior to working as a learning support teacher, she also taught as a classroom teacher at Tara Anglican School for Girls where she completed her ISTAA Experienced Teacher Accreditation. She also worked as a Learning Support Teacher at Knox Preparatory School and One-School.

Session Information

Specific Learning Disabilities in Reading (often referred to as Dyslexia) is a term that refers to difficulty in acquiring and processing language that is typically manifested by the lack or proficiency in reading, spelling and writing. This is a common condition, approximately 5-10% of people have this, that makes it hard to work with language. It is important as educators to know that Dyslexia is not an intelligence deficit nor is it a result of laziness. People with Dyslexia do not outgrow it but there are a range of strategies that educators can equip students with to help them improve their reading skills and manage these challenges. In this workshop we will explore some myths and facts about Dyslexia, common signs and symptoms and how it is usually diagnosed.

In addition to a range of practical classroom adjustments, there are some amazing innovative tools and assistive technologies (AT) to support students with Dyslexia which are also beneficial for other students in the classroom.

This workshop aims to develop the understanding and skills of teachers working with students with Dyslexia to support inclusive practice and improve student learning. We will explore the underlying processes and causes of Dyslexia as identified by extensive neuroscience research on the differences in brain function of people with Dyslexia. Teachers will be able to incorporate this knowledge to implement informed and effective instructional practice and evidence-based interventions while highlighting the incredible strengths associated with Dyslexia to promote positive and successful life-long learners.
